Read the verses from the following pages to learn about David's life:


- How he defeats Goliath.

KING DAVID

Luke 2:1-7: The Birth of Jesus

So Joseph went up from the town of Nazareth to Bethlehem, the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went with Mary, who gave birth to Jesus. Mary wrapped him and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them at the inn.

1 Samuel 16:1-13: Samuel Anoints David

The Lord said to Samuel, "Fill your horn with oil. I am sending you to Jesse. I have chosen one of his sons to be king."

Samuel did what the Lord said. He saw Elijab and Abinadab and Shammah and Jesse's other sons. Samuel said to Jesse, "The Lord has not chosen these. Are these all the sons you have?"

"There is still the youngest," Jesse answered, "but he is tending sheep." When David arrived, the Lord said, "Rise and anoint him. He is the one."

1 Samuel 17: David and Goliath

The Philistines gathered their forces for war. Their champion was Goliath. He was over nine feet tall and had a helmet and armor of bronze, with a javelin slung on his back.

David, though he was still a boy, said that he would fight Goliath. While guarding the sheep, he had killed both lions and bears. David said, "The Lord who delivered me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine."

David had his sling in hand. Reaching into his bag and taking out a stone, David, slung it and struck the Philistine in the forehead.

2 Samuel 5:1-5: David Becomes King over Israel

David was thirty years old when he became king, and he reigned forty years.

2 Samuel 22: David's Song of Praise

David sang to the Lord when the Lord delivered him from the hand of all his enemies. He is credited with singing the Psalms.

Psalm 100, says, "Shout for you to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.
